# POLICY STATEMENT & ACTION PLAN 2021 – 2026

This report has been prepared in accordance with the Environment (Wales) Act 2016 Part 1 – Section 6, the Biodiversity and Resilience of Ecosystems Duty.

The administrative area of Whitford Community Council covers the following villages: Carmel, Gorsedd, Lloc, Pantasaph, and Whitford. The population of the area is 1,898 (January 2023 Register of Electors).

The Whitford Community Council precept for the financial year 2023 / 2024 is £59,000.00. This amount is precept on residential properties within the community, and equates to a figure of £50.08 per household on a Band D property.

At the current time, Whitford Community Council are owners of two areas of land namely: Pen Y Gelli Nature reserve in Lloc and The Bryn in Carmel – as referred to within this document. Both these areas are nature and biodiversity friendly.
