The Council

Community Councils were established under the Local Government Act 1972 and replaced the previous system of Parish Councils. There are over 730 Town & Community Councils in Wales, with over 8,000 Councillors.

The administrative area of Halkyn Community Council covers the following villages: Halkyn, Moel Y Crio, Pentre Halkyn, Rhes Y Cae, Rhosesmor, The Nant, The Wern and The Windmill.

The population of the area is 2,314 (January 2025 Register of Electors).

During the reporting year all Council meetings were held hybrid with the face to face venue being the Halkyn Parish Hall.

Council meetings are held on the third Monday of the month (no meetings held in August and December) and commence at 7.30pm. Non-scheduled meetings can be held in an emergency or possibly in relation to an urgent planning application – especially during the months of December and August. All meetings will be publicly advertised.

The agenda for the meetings are advertised locally including the Council's web site a few days prior to the meeting. Residents of the community and press are welcome to attend all meetings. Residents are also able to address the Council Members for a reasonable period of time at the commencement of the meeting on matters appertaining to the community.

Should any resident, or press member wish to connect to a meeting by audio, please advise the Clerk to the Council by providing at least three days notice prior to the meeting date.

Complaints

During the reporting year there were no complaints made against the Council, to either the Flintshire Standards Committee or the Wales Public Services Ombudsman

Councillors

During the reporting year there were thirteen members of the Halkyn Community Council, with Councillor Howard Morris as Chair of Council and Councillor Delyth Taylor as Vice Chair. Councillors' Ray Faulder-Jones and Dylan Roberts tendered their resignations for personal reasons. Following display of Public Notices there was no call for elections, with the County Returning Officer authorising the vacancies to be filled by co-option. Councillors' Jennifer Parry and David Case were co-opted.

Council's objectives - 2024 / 2025

(Update in italics)

During the 2024 / 2025 financial year, apart from the general powers and lawfully required duties, the Community Council have agreed the additional following priorities:

* To continue to support and enhance the Community Council area for the benefit of the residents. The Community Council continue their support to the community, with many examples listed below.

- ❖ To further place funds in ear-marked reserves towards Council Cemetery -Enhancement Scheme - £10,000.00 (Funds to be saved in ear-marked reserves over a period of three to five years). Whilst funds were initially ring-fenced none were utilised. The Council will place on hold this project for future discussion.
- * To continue to provide and repair street lighting to the community. On-going.
- ❖ The Community Council will continue to be proactive in reporting concerns to Flintshire Street Scene, such as pot holes, fly-tipping and other highway related concerns, including public footpaths. *On-going*.
- Training budget (Councillors & Clerk). All Councillors completed a Code of Conduct refresher course. Councillors also completed other courses.
- To continue to provide funding for:
 - Library Service at Halkyn Parish Hall. Completed. The Community Council also provided financial assistance to the Halkyn Parish Hall for roof repairs and installation of new water heaters.
 - Children's Summer Play Schemes in Rhosesmor. Completed.
 - Local Committees and Groups, including local and national charities who support the community. Completed, including £1,000 to Halkyn Cricket Club and £1,400 to Halkyn Junior Football Club – both for capital purchases. All financial assistance recipients are recorded in the Council's minutes of meetings
 - Further enhancement to Children's play areas (Match funding with Flintshire County Council), with an emphasis on accessible play equipment, including picnic tables. The sum of £25,000 was spent in the Halkyn and Rhosesmor play area with the Community Council providing 50% of the cost at £12,500.00. The County Council were unable, at this time, to include accessible equipment
 - Halkyn Mountain News. The Community Council provided a donation of £2,000.00 towards the quarterly printing costs of the publication – to ensure that all households within the community were able to receive a free copy
 - Rhes Y Cae Village Hall: This Village Hall is the smallest Hall within the Community whereby the Community Council were pleased to purchase and donate to the Hall 70 new chairs
 - Community Award: The Council seeked from residents nominations for a Community Award. Two worthy recipients received a framed certificate and crystal glassware.

❖ To continue to support and enhance the Community Council area for the benefit of the residents.

- ❖ To continue to provide and repair street lighting to the community
- ❖ The Community Council will continue to be proactive in reporting concerns to Flintshire Street Scene, such as pot holes, fly-tipping, overgrown hedges, trees obstructing visibility on highways, together with other highway related concerns, including public footpaths
- Community Award: To seek nominations for a 2025 Community Award
- ❖ To continue to provide funding for:
 - Library Service at Halkyn Parish Hall
 - Children's Summer Play Scheme in Rhosesmor
 - Local Committees and Groups, including local and national charities who support the community
 - Community / Village Halls
 - Further enhancement including equipment within the Children's play area in Rhes Y Cae (Match funding with Flintshire County Council)
- Continue to work with Flintshire Bio-diversity Officers, including others, to enhance bio-diversity within the Community Council area
- Training budget (Councillors & Clerk)

(Funding for the above projects, if required, will be utilised from the annual precept and reserves)

Financial

Asset Register

The value of the Community Council's asset register totals £63,989.00. A copy of the register can be obtained from the Clerk to the Council.

Council budget

The Halkyn Community Council precept for the financial year 2024 / 2025 was £50,000.00. This amount is precept on residential properties within the community, and equates to a figure of £36.95 per household on a Band D property. There were 1,353 Band D household properties within the Halkyn Community area – as at January 2024.

The Band D household precept for the Halkyn Community Council area, is made up as follows:

Flintshire County Council £1,658.25 Police & Crime Commissioner £349.65 Halkyn Community Council £36.95

The Community Council's precept for 2025 / 2026 was set at £53,000.00

Financial Assistance

Each year, Halkyn Community Council considers requests for financial assistance to support the work of its local groups, organisations and charities. Grants are specifically made by the Council in the interest of its local area and its residents. The Council allocates grants for financial assistance from the annual precept, in accordance with Section 137 (Local Government Act 1972) and other National and Wales Government Acts

During the reporting year the Community Council granted a number of applications for financial assistance, which totalled: £3,635.00 under Section 137 and £5,250.00 under various Local Government Acts. Details of these grants are included in the Council's minutes of meetings

Members Allowance

Payments (Allowances) to Members of Halkyn Community Council - 2024 / 2025 In accordance with Section 151 of the Local Government Measure 2011, Community and Town Councils must publish within their authority area the remuneration received by their Members by 30th September following the end of the year to which the payment relates. The information must also be sent to the Independent Remuneration Panel for Wales (IRPfW) by the same date.

Halkyn Community Council provided the previous years return prior to the required date to the (IRPfW). Flintshire County Council

In 2014 the Community Council agreed to adopt the following: A Shared Community – Charter between Flintshire County Council and Town & Community Councils in the County. Two Councillors and the Clerk to the Council represent this Council at the County Forum meetings, which are generally held twice a year, together with representatives from all 34 Town & Community Councils in Flintshire. The Flintshire County Council did not arrange meetings during this reporting year.

Planning Applications

The Community Council is not a planning authority and as such does not make final decisions on planning applications; this is the responsibility of Flintshire County Council.

However, the Community Council is a statutory consultee and as such receives all planning applications relating to the community. The Community Council do make their respective comments and suggestions on all planning applications, including requesting site meetings.

Street Lighting

The street lighting in the Halkyn Community Council area is administered jointly between the Community Council and Flintshire County Council. Whilst the majority of the street lights on the adopted housing estate roads are the responsibility of Flintshire County Council, the street lighting, generally sited on roadside wooden poles, are the responsibility of the Community Council.
